



## FOCUS ON: Local Church Ministries Grant

Many initiatives are underway since the **Church Development program of the Conference** began 3 years ago. The Conference's work in congregational revitalization and new church starts has been recognized by the national setting of the United Church of Christ. We have been awarded a **grant of \$200,000 from Local Church Ministries** to continue and to expand our Church Development Program. This is good news, as well as a real vote of confidence in our efforts. The grant will be given in quarterly amounts of \$25,000 over the next two years, beginning July 1, 2009.

Here are a few conditions of the grant:

1. We will need to match the grant in order to do all that we want to do in Church Development over the next 3-5 years, doubling it to \$400,000. You will learn more about how we will do this through the Ensuring Our Future initiative of PSEC.
2. All funding from this grant will go to support leadership development in local churches: 2/3 for new church leadership and training, 1/3 for congregational revitalization.
3. No funds are to be used to support staff salaries.
4. A portion of the funding will support on-going clergy/lay leadership development.

Attendees at the Spring Meeting of the Conference signed their names to a giant poster of thanks to express our love and appreciation to Local Church Ministries for this generous grant. It was very moving to watch delegates step forward to sign the poster as a sign of their acceptance of the partnership with Local Church Ministries.

If your church has not been a part of our PSEC program of renewal, ask your leaders to consider participating in 2010. A brochure, which lists two orientation sessions next September, is available on the PSEC website. We serve a powerful God who is able to do things we cannot even imagine! Get involved in the program and be surprised by what God will do in and through your church!
