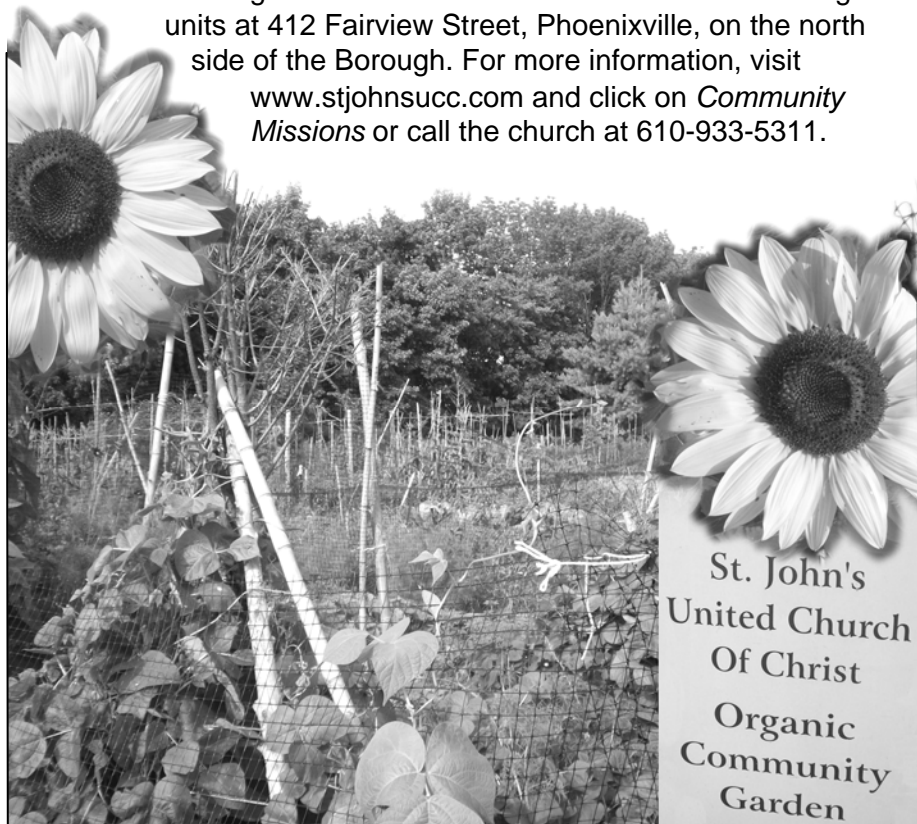




## FOCUS ON: St. John's UCC Organic Community Garden

St. John's UCC **Organic Community Garden** is the primary supplier of in-season, fresh produce to the food bank at Phoenixville Area Community Services. People in the Phoenixville area who want to grow their own food organically may participate. The only requirements include using organic growing techniques and donating 10% (Biblical tith) to someone in need or to a local agency which works on behalf of others. It was founded in 1991. In June of 2005, youth helpers completed a **48-foot-diameter turf labyrinth** on the edge of the garden that is now listed on the World-Wide Labyrinth Locator. It is a wonderful place to sit, read, meditate and walk. Everyone is welcome. The garden is located behind the Fairview Housing units at 412 Fairview Street, Phoenixville, on the north side of the Borough.
