FOCUS ON: Community Service

St. Thomas UCC in Reading has a long tradition of serving its neighbors by opening its building for the use of community service organizations such as the Reading Area Community College (RACC) and Family Promise of Berks County. That tradition took a new form on August 15th when St. Thomas held its first Open House and Safety Awareness Day.

The event enabled residents of the church's neighborhood to learn about a variety of organizations and programs dedicated to serving the people of Reading and Berks County. The Berks County Sheriff's Department brought their "I.D. Me"



child identification program, and the Miller-Keystone Blood Bank provided information on blood donation. Teachers from RACC's "Even Start Family Literacy" and "English as a Second Language" programs explained the classes they offer, and the Red Cross had an exhibit on safety and disaster response. A park ranger from Blue Marsh Lake provided literature in English and Spanish on water safety, and there was a display on food safety and gardening from the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture. The Reading Police K-9 Unit put on a demonstration, and the Reading Fire Department's



Engine 9 paid a visit. Representatives from Grace (Alsace) UCC's Venture Crew youth program also participated. St. Thomas members provided tours of the building, there was a "bouncy house" for the children and, of course, food was available.

The Open House and Safety Awareness Day couldn't have happened without the hard work of many volunteers. And they're already planning to do it again—even bigger and better—next year!
