Focus On: Serving Christ as Our Neighbor



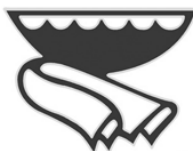
Church World Service has issued an urgent appeal for donations of CWS Hygiene and Baby Care kits, asking individuals, families, and religious and civic groups to join in local efforts to assemble CWS kits for distribution to survivors of the earthquake in Haiti. With hundreds of thousands of people homeless, the need for kits is immediate. Supplies and

hygiene and medical resources of all kinds are desperately lacking. So, a toothbrush, a comb and a bar of soap or diapers and a baby blanket seem like priceless gifts. These one-gallon bag-sized packets of hygiene and baby care supplies are an important lifeline for people with little or nothing. For over 60 years, Church World Service has provided emergency relief, sustainable development, and refugee assistance. 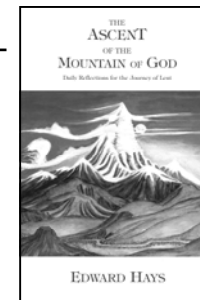
